The following is a list of words often used amongst peers (people with disability). This list is to help us all understand what we mean.

1. Peer

Short	Any peer can be a leader.

11.To be humble

Short	You know who are and you might be very good at

13. Reflection

Short	Thinking about what happened and then changing

14. Confidentiality

Short	An agreement about what can and what can't be

15. I get you - factor

Short	Having shared experiences with someone else often

16. Reciprocal/ mutually beneficial
